

Where did you go to college and what did you study? I went to College of the Sequoias as well as Fresno State and Gallaudet University. My main focus was theater and interpreting.


What's the most interesting thing that happened to you? I met my now husband while on a date with one of his friends.

What are the most important issues to you? I love the idea of helping family and the most important issue for me is making a difference!


What do you want to see in the future? A Learning Center for parents of Deaf and Hard of Hearing children and those who want to become an interpreter, with me directing it!
