- V. President's Report Joshua Blanco read Janice Smith-Warshaw notes

VI. Vice President's Report - Joshua Blanco

- a. Rummage Sale We raised \$1,917.37 for the sale. It was very difficult work. Thank you to Susan C. and the DHHSC staff as I know it caused a lot of stress, but we raised a record amount. We had some issues arise during the rummage sale, such as challenges with volunteers, pricing, and things being put on hold and we can talk about the planning for next year. We should have a committee in place to address these issues and to establish some ground rules and expectation. It would be nice to double or triple what we raised this year.
- b. Deaf-Blind camp We are excited to be involved with a Deaf-Blind camp that will happen in September. The camp is located in Oregon. We have 30 Deaf-blind

individuals that have signed up for the camp. We will have people from all over the U.S., not only here in California. We need to have about 20 SSPs, we have about 10-15 people in mind that we plan to ask.

- c. DHHSC Board Recruitment I was speaking to some members in the community about joining the board. Sal Garcia was one person we had in mind, but he is not interested at this time. I recently conducted an interview Serena Johnson to discuss her interest in joining the board. She was supposed to join this evening, but she is out of town dealing with important family matters. She will join the board officially next month and she is terrific. I plan to reach out to other members, potentially in Visalia and other outlying areas.

IX. Executive Director's report- Michelle Bronson Funding Updates:

We are very pleased to share that we received United Way of Tulare County funding in the amount of \$9,200! This is the first time we've had UWTC in more than 10 years, and we are very pleased that we have been approved as one of their grantees. This grant provides ASL instruction, literacy and tutoring services, and mentoring to D/HH youth. The grant started yesterday (Monday, April 10th) and we are determined to do our best

and meet all the goals as outlined in the grant so we can continue receiving funding from UWTC. A big thank you to UWTC!

In addition, we are very pleased to share that we received \$1,000 from Central California Women's Conference for deSIGN art classes/workshops for D/HH women and children. We will use some of this grant money to bring a well-known Deaf artist, Nancy Rourke, to Fresno on Oct. 7th. She will do a two-hour workshop on painting, and as you may know, she uses primary colors in her art. She also paints about controversial issues, and it will be great to have her here in October, sharing about her art and her life.

We are one of the top five contenders for Students4Giving for \$6,000 funding in Board/Management leadership and fundraising training. If selected, we will be invited to do a presentation to a class at FSU on April 18th at 4 p.m. I am hopeful we get this grant because we need this training, especially in the area of fundraising.

I would like to thank everyone who participated in the See's Candy Fundraiser. We raised over \$422, and one of our Salinas staff, Krystal Rios, won the staff competition. She received a box of See's chocolates as a prize.

We will try a new fundraiser through Double Good, a popcorn company that specializes in different flavors of popcorn. We want to continue trying different fundraisers that require minimal effort, involve delicious food, and bring in extra funds for our agency.

We would like to congratulate our Board of Directors for raising more than \$1,900 at our Rummage Sale! The board did a marvelous job in getting donations, sorting through the items, setting up the different areas of the rummage sale, and the pricing. Congratulations, everyone!

Staffing Updates:

Erin Ruiz's last day with us was on March 24th and we wish her all the best with her new interpreting position at FSU. We are very proud of her and are glad we will still see her around, especially at FSU's Deaf-related events.

We are pleased to share that we have hired Jacque Fitzpatrick as our subcontractor for the Communication Assistance Program funded by Monterey Peninsula Foundation. She joined us last week and will only work part-time (10-15 hours a week) with us until Oct. 1st, when the grant cycle ends.

Agency Updates:

We found a new office for our Visalia Outreach office and the move-in date is this Thursday. It is a very nice office, much nicer than our current space, and much cheaper. It is also in a better location, situated in downtown Visalia. Our Visalia staff will host an all-day Open House on May 9th, and I hope you can go! We are also trying to set up a fundraiser in the area, such as at Deli Delicious or a nearby lunch place, for the same day.

We are still looking for an office for our Merced Outreach office, but it's harder to find a nice, cheaper, yet safe, space in that area. Some of the offices we've been looking at are almost just as expensive as our current office, but smaller, which do not meet our budget needs. One office we looked at was cute but had no elevators, which is not ADA-compliant. We will continue looking until we find one that meets our needs.

Agency Events:

We had a very successful Family Day event last Saturday. More than 17 parents of Deaf and Hard of Hearing children attended, and we were thrilled with the turnout. Last year we only had three families, and more came this year. The FSU students who worked with us were wonderful, and they coordinated the children's activities. The event was sponsored by Fansler Foundation, and we provided refreshments, booths, materials, and games for the families. For example, we had a hand classifier game and a scavenger hunt that required signing and interaction among the families. We also had ASL and Spanish interpreters present, and the families shared that they had a great time.

If we could charge a small fee for delivery on top of the sale, we might

be able to sell more items. (JB) I think it's a great idea and it's an idea that we can discuss when we plan for the rummage sale next year.
