TEN TIPS FOR PARENTS OF DEAF AND HARD OF HEARING KIDS

Start Early

Begin support services for your child as soon as you can. Early exposure to language is really important for learning and brain development. Research shows babies can sign at a few months of age!

Learn about Deaf Culture

Get to know the Deaf Community and our unique ways of communication. Understanding and respecting Deaf culture will help you support your child better.

Build Your Communication Toolkit

We encourage all parents to incorporate ASL into their Communication Toolkit; your child will benefit from having both ASL and English and possibly hearing aids or cochlear implants. Every child is different, so work with Deaf professionals to find what suits your child best. Relying on technology alone is a limited path.

Fight for Equitable and Accessible Education

Make sure your child gets the same educational opportunities as other kids. Work with teachers and Deaf advocates to get the right support.

Connect with Other Parents

Talk with other parents who are going through similar experiences. Sharing stories and advice can be really helpful.

Encourage Independence

Help your child become more independent. This can boost self-confidence.

Expose Your Child to Different Experiences

Let your child try out different activities. This will help your child become more well-rounded, confident, and boost communication skills.

Celebrate Achievements

Celebrate your child's successes, big and small. Positive reinforcement builds self-confidence.

Be Patient and Flexible

Understand that parenting a Deaf child might require more patience and flexibility. Be open to adjusting how you communicate and parent as your child grows.
