Wildfire and Accessible Shelter Information from CalOES

Below is a list of updated fire status, and accessible emergency shelters in Los Angeles County compiled by our partners at the California Governor's Office of Emergency Services (CalOES) and the California Department of Social Services (DSS).



Updated fire information as of (1/15 at 9:00 AM)

Palisades, Vegetation Fire, Los Angeles County

- 23,713 acres (+0 acres), brush, 19% contained (+1% containment)
- Minimal fire behavior with creeping and smoldering
- Threat to structures and critical infrastructure
- Evacuation orders and warnings remain in place

Eaton, Vegetation Fire, Los Angeles County

- 14,117 acres (+0 acres), grass and brush, 45% contained (+10% containment)
- Minimal fire behavior with backing, creeping and smoldering
- Evacuation orders and warnings remain in place
- Threat to structures and critical infrastructure

TRANSPORTATION

If you are asked to evacuate and need help with transportation you can utilize Uber and Lyft for free to shelter and evacuation sites:

- **Lyft:** Two free rides up to \$25 each. Use code: **CAFIRERELIEF25**.
- **Uber:** Two free rides up to \$40 each. Use code: **WILDFIRE25**.
